Agencies were asked to provide client satisfaction information regarding programs currently being funded. ▪ Two clients were questioned from each funded program. Eight qualitative questions were presented to the clients. Two collaborating agencies were also asked questions regarding satisfaction with the program's services. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ CBCAP grantees blend funds to enhance service development, operation, and expansion. They blend funds from state, federal, public and private sources. ▪ Blended funding has supported the training of employees, community education and outreach and service expansion and transportation

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The lead agency revised the peer review process during the reporting period. The process was restructured to increase the focus on the programmatic operations and services provided by CBCAP grantee agencies. ▪ Another goal of the new peer review process was to gather information from multiple sources in order to strengthen the validity of the review. ▪ Additional components that were added to the peer review tool include: Direct Observation of Program Activities; Interview with a Collaborating Agency; Interview with Program Participants. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The lead agency is working with CBCAP agencies to understand that the network is not grantee driven but parent driven. ▪ The Advisory Board continues to assist and direct efforts of the network to open lines of communication among network members and other public and private agencies and service providers, ensuring the meaningful involvement of consumer parents in leadership roles. ▪ There is continued focus on coordinated planning and delivery of services such as training and technical assistance, peer review and evaluation; identifying challenges and barriers to service delivery; and soliciting network input into the development of a report to the state legislature, outlining strengths and weaknesses in service delivery to Indiana's families and children.
